CEPARE analysis:		
George, Kate and Tom have met twice with a group from CEPARE (Center for Education Policy, Applied Research and Evaluation) in hopes that they can help us research and analyze data to support our work on budget metrics. They seem enthusiastic about the data available and the prospect of creating a credible report around school budgets in Scarborough.	George and Kate to receive proposal and share with Committee.	After February 11 meeting with CEPARE.
They recommended first identifying a viable cohort group, then gathering data to compare within that group. They will present us with a proposal and a cost at a follow-up meeting on February 11; we have asked for the report to be completed by mid-March.		
The Committee discussed the difficulty of presenting data to the community when we as school leaders can be perceived as biased and our reporting dismissed as unreliable. CEPARE would offer an independent view that would hopefully be more effective.		
Revenues:		
The Committee discussed the news from Augusta of potential \$1.5M reduction in Scarborough's state subsidy for FY17. If we are able to tackle this as a loss to the town as a whole rather than just to the schools, we will be able to preserve the problem-solving approach that has been undertaken by the joint Finance Committees.
